We had a further inspection from HMI last month, and we are delighted to say that the inspectors recognised the rapid improvement that the school has made since the last inspection in September.

Inspectors said that "Standards in the Early Years Foundation Stage have improved. More children are reaching the level of development expected for their age. This is because a significant proportion are beginning to make more rapid progress in literacy and mathematics." "Children are also beginning to make more rapid progress in Key Stage 1." And at Key Stage 2: "Tracking systems show that in most cases, pupils are on track to make at least average progress in reading, writing and mathematics over two years."

It is good to report that the view of the inspectors is that: "The school is making reasonable progress towards the removal of special measures". However, we still have much more work to do to ensure that all our pupils achieve their best and that inspectors judge that the school is good. The report will be published on the school website in the next few days.

There will be an opportunity for staff to meet with the IEB and representatives of the LDBSAT on Wednesday 11th February at 4.00pm to discuss the proposal.


