#### **Trips & Visits**

#### <u>Homework</u>



Please ask your class teacher if you do not have a copy of the class homework schedule. All children from Year 2 – 6 should have two pieces of homework to be completed each week from their "Workabooks". (Of course this is in addition to reading, spelling and times-tables practice!)

#### **School environment**

Very shortly we shall be having 2 large projects beginning in school.



- In order to enhance site security, we shall be automating the pedestrian gates in Belton Road. These gates will be open in the morning and at the end of the day. During the school day and from 5.30, the gates will operate on a buzz-in system, similar to the new car gates.
- At the end of this term we shall have our new library installed in Oxgate classroom.
   This will work on a system similar to a public library, where the books will be electronically catalogued and scanned in/out of stock. This will help us to track the reading habits of children and hopefully encourage them to access our stock of books more frequently.

#### **Charity giving**

On the 18<sup>th</sup> of February we started our "**Pennies for Leprosy**" appeal, which we run every year during the season of Lent. *With every £10 it is possible to buy the medicine needed to cure someone of Leprosy*. Our children find it rewarding to think that they can count the money their class has raised during the 6 weeks of Lent and work out how many people they can help to recover from this terrible, yet easily remedied disease. Please encourage the children to bring in their spare change each day and put it in their class jar. As usual, there will be a prize for the class who collect the most.

### **World Book Day**

World Book Day is Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> March. Just to remind you, we have asked the children and staff to dress up as a character from a book. There will be prizes for those costumes judged to be the most original. In addition, the school will be holding a book fair in the new library. So, look out for more information.
